This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils’ music education.

### **Part A: Curriculum music**

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Our intent for Music at Welburn Primary School is to develop children who:

- listen to different kinds of music including from different eras and cultures.
- enjoy a range of different musical experiences.
- explore creating different kinds of music using a range of instruments.
- are able to sing as part of a group.
- know the elements of music .
- use these elements to develop their understanding of music.
- can perform music to a range of audiences.

Our curriculum is based on musical elements and also references the DFE’s Model Music Curriculum.

All our curriculum subjects follow an inclusive approach and teachers adapt the curriculum using various different strategies including: pre teaching, adult support, variations on instruments used and use of ear defenders etc. We aim to for at least 60 minutes of music per week.

We use glockenspiels and Chrome Music Lab for whole class instrument work.

## **Part B: Co-curricular music**

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Pupils have the opportunity to access specific instrument tuition through NYC music offer and Music for Schools. Currently we have pupils learning clarinet, cornet and guitar.

Lessons are 30 minutes per week

## **Part C: Musical experiences**

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Pupils have many opportunities to perform throughout the year.

We hold weekly singing assemblies.

A singing group entertains at the village Christmas fair and all our pupils sing carols around our 'feeder' villages on the last day of Christmas Term.

Groups and classes will perform at school events such as Open Mornings and church services.

We hold a Carnival every 4 years which includes drumming and other musical styles.

We also took all of KS2 to Young Voices in Sheffield in 2024 and this will happen at least once in KS2.

We also invite musicians into school and in June our pupils took part in an Organ Workshop in the village school. We have also had Japanese Drumming workshop recently.

## **In the future**
